



## 2017 Jr's Grand Slam – Tournament Info:

All matches best of 3, first two sets to 25, if needed deciding 3rd set to 15 switch sides at 8. All sets Win by 2, No-Cap.

Warm-ups: 2-4-4 for all matches. (\* 2 minute shared time will start immediately following prior match) Warm-Ups may be shortened with both coaches consent. Teams should show court courtesy and shag balls for each other during warm-ups.

Work teams will need to be on time and provide a down ref, 2-linejudges, a scorekeeper, a libero tracker, and a scoreboard operator.

If you are in a 3 team on Saturday – Please look at your reffing and play schedule closely on AES – There is a possibility that your team may switch courts after the conclusion of their initial 3 team pool, so don't miss one of your matches or reffing assignments in your secondary pool or challenge match.

A Coach must stay in the area of their team for the entirety of their Work Team assignment. Failure to fully comply with the above may result in sanctions in their following match.

USA-Volleyball Rules will be followed with the following exceptions:

No tie-breaking sets will be played for tied teams at the conclusion of pool play.

2 teams tied – tie-breaker = head to head

3 or more teams tied – tie-breaker order = match record, sets record, pt. differential, coin-flip.

**Wisconsin Center:** The tournament will be held in Halls A and B of the Wisconsin Center. The Wisconsin Center is located at 4<sup>th</sup> and Wisconsin Ave. in Milwaukee, WI.

There are two levels of escalators to reach the courts. The first escalator is for all to take. For the 2<sup>nd</sup> level of escalator, the south escalator will be for spectators and the north escalator will be for players and coaches.

**Awards:** Medals will be awarded to the players on the top 3 teams in all Gold Divisions and Also Champions of the Silver Champions for the 13/14's, 15/16's, and 17/18's age group.

**Waivers/Rosters:** AES or Webpoint rosters are accepted. Age waivers are allowed. Please present region or governing body written proof of granted waiver at time of check-in with your roster.

Team registration will take place at the top of the coach/player escalator on Saturday morning starting at 7:00 a.m. and be available throughout the day. Only coaches actually in attendance will receive wristbands for entry.

AES Rosters will be printed on Friday morning at 9:00 a.m. The printed rosters, or a webpoint, aes, or region rosters will also be accepted and will need to be signed/dated at the team registration.

**Admission:** Admission is \$7 a day or \$10 for the 2-day pass for anyone 12 or older that is not coaching or playing in the tournament.

**Results:** All live results will be posted on Advancedeventsystems. We will have 2 public computers to view results. Public WiFi is only available in the commons area.

A trainer may or may not be on-site for the entirety of the tournament. Our contracted trainers are not available and we are trying to find a suitable replacement, but if not, ice will be available at the tournament desk for those that need ice, but taping and injury evaluation will be on your own.

Coolers and Chairs are not allowed in the Wisconsin Center.

11/12's: 8 teams – 4 Team Pools on Saturday – Challenge matches to start on Sunday with 4 teams advancing to Gold and 4 teams advancing to Silver

13/14's: 16 teams – *A couple of the strongest 14's teams requested to be moved into the 15/16's division hence there is no longer a need to have Power Pools as the competition level from the top to the bottom of the field is similar.* 4 team pools on Saturday with top 2 teams advancing to Gold and 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place teams advancing to Silver in 8 team brackets on Sunday.

15/16's: 26 teams – 2 Power Pools and 6 Standard Pools of 3 – Challenge Matches for 6 Power Pool teams and 6 top Standard Pool teams to advance to Gold and Silver. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place teams in Standard pools advance to secondary 3 team pools and then to Bronze, Copper, and Platinum Brackets.

17/18's: 15 Teams – Pools of 3 – 2 Power Pools and 3 Standard Pools. All Teams advance to secondary 3 team pools played immediately after initial pools on Saturday. Top 6 teams will advance to Gold, Next 6 pool finishing teams advance to Silver, and bottom 3 teams advance to Bronze.
